The Family & Youth Services Bureau's (FYSB) Runaway & Homeless Youth (RHY) Program is now recruiting grant panelists to support the review and evaluation of FY 2020 federal grant applications for the Street Outreach Program (SOP). Through the SOP, FYSB supports work with homeless, runaway, street youth and possibly youth exposed to human trafficking to help them find safe and stable housing and services.

## Qualifications:

- Must be a professional with human services or public health experience, to include program work in at-risk youth, youth experiencing homelessness, and/or crisis intervention, understanding the components of logic models in relation to intended project results, or a student pursuing a degree in a human services field.
- Must have strong organizational and time management skills.
- Must be able to analyze and evaluate complex materials.
- Must have strong writing and editing skills.
- Must be comfortable participating in a virtual team environment.
- Must be available to participate in mandatory training webinars.
- Must have ability to effectively utilize the internet and web-based technology.
- Must be fluent in writing and speaking in English.
- Must be committed to the review process for the duration.

## Tools Required:

- Windows or Mac-based interface
- Adobe Acrobat or other PDF reader

## Level of Commitment:

- Participate in approximately three (3) mandatory training sessions.
- Devote a minimum of **6-8 hours daily** over a period of two weeks to read, evaluate and score applications.
- Devote 3-4 days for panel consensus discussion, if necessary.
- Be available a minimum of 4 hours between 9am (EST) and 5pm (EST) for the consensus discussions.
- Be on call or available at short notice during the process.
